3. Innovations in Curricular Design and Transaction

The Curriculum template was designed and the curriculum of all departments was revised during 2008-'09, based on the recommendations of the State Government of Tamilnadu and hence given in AQAR 2008-'09. The new papers introduced for II, III UG and II PG are as follows.

3.1 Curricular innovations in the departments.

Department of Tamil

PG – TP4C1 - செம்மொழித் தமிழ்

Department of Mathematics

To introduce the main components of fuzzy set theory and fuzzy numbers, a new paper on “Fuzzy sets and fuzzy numbers” is introduced for III year students in the VI semester.

Department of Chemistry

- Spectroscopy for III D.C. to make the students learn how to identify samples and to give a practical knowledge of introducing the sample, analysis and study of the spectra obtained.
- Food preservation as an elective paper to make the students learn the chemistry of food storage, food spoilage, additives and coloring agents added and the limits of their usage.

Department of Zoology

Project paper “Nutrition and Health” has been changed to “Clinical Nutrition and Health Lab” to give hands-on-training to the students in various healthy preparations of food items and prepare chart for various common ailments.

Department of Computer Science

- Computer graphics
- Active server pages
- Java server pages
- System software

Department of Commerce

- Tally 9 for III D.C. to provide working knowledge on Tally 9.
- Business Mathematic for II D.C. to enable the students to appear for competitive / entrance examinations for MBA and MCA.

Department of Business Administration

- MAT - I as Skill based elective to strengthen the knowledge of the students to appear for the competitive exams.
- Managenerial skills as Non-major elective to give basic knowledge about the human relation aspects in the work spot and to give knowledge about stress, fatigue and how to overcome them.
- MAT – II as Skill based elective to know about the problems based on age, percentage, profit and loss, speed and time etc and give knowledge about reasoning puzzles, inserting the missing character, logical word sequences etc.
- Executive communication as Non-major elective to educate the students about the important role of communication and to give knowledge about the advancements of technology in communication.
- Business Mathematics to enable the students to have basic knowledge in Mathematics that help in business accounting.

3.2 Innovations in Curricular Transactions

The following are the new teaching methods followed by the different departments which are unique to their respective disciplines.

Department of Tamil

Department of Mathematics

Problem solving and analytic methods are the new teaching methods unique to the department.

Department of Chemistry

Charts and models are frequently used and teaching theory is assisted by demonstration. Students are directed to do net reference and collect materials relevant to the subject matter.

Department of Computer Science

For few papers, teaching is done using video clippings.

Department of Commerce

- Live teaching of computer based papers – MS Office and Tally 9 with the help of LCD.
- Factory visit to expose the students on Eco-friendly policy of business corporate.

Department of Business Administration

For Case analysis, Group discussion and conversation are followed. Oral test is given at the end of every week.

As per the guidelines given by the State Government, with effect from 2008-'09, it is compulsory that every student should take two skill based electives in first and second semesters and one skill based elective + one non-major elective offered by other departments in UG course in third and fourth semesters. All the faculty members use LCD and OHP in their teaching methodology. The student presentations, subject wise and field work presentations are done using LCD and OHP. The faculty extensively use internet in their academic work and students are given specific assignments for the same.

After the interface meeting, three level course on “Communicative and Functional English” proposed by the Department of English was sanctioned by UGC and will be implemented in the next academic year.
- * Syllabi for II & III UG and II PG are revised as per the guidelines given by the State Government of Tamilnadu including recent topics and books.
- * All the regular curricular, co-curricular and extracurricular activities are continued and reported under various heads of this report.

PART – D

Plans of HEI for the next year.

The following plan is proposed for the next academic year to ensure continuous improvement in all practices.

- * To prepare the entire college campus for the visit from Mother Teresa Women's University, Kodaikanal and UGC on the renewal of autonomy.
- * As sanctioned by UGC, to conduct Certificate course on “Communicative and Functional English”, as the first level of three level course under Career Oriented Courses.
